



2021 Kodiak Crab Festival Art Show Sponsored by Kodiak Arts Council & The Frame Shop

Sponsoring organizations The Frame Shop and Kodiak Arts Council invite Kodiak artists to submit new original creative work to be included in the 21st annual Kodiak Crab Festival Art Show. The 2021 Art Show will be in-person and staged at the Kodiak Harbormaster building in downtown Kodiak. A virtual companion exhibit will be built online to reach a broad audience and provide viewing access from home.

Eligible Media

Accepting all contemporary and fine art genre submissions from Kodiak artists. All work must have been completed within the past three years (2018 - 2021) and not previously exhibited at the Crab Festival Art Show. Eligible media include, but are not limited to: drawing, painting, photography, mixed media, oil/chalk pastels, block/ink print, pottery/vessels, sculpture, collage, digital art, metal work, jewelry design, fiber/textile art, wood work, and ceramics.

Entries must be delivered suitably finished and ready for display. All paper and canvas work must be matted and framed; works of sculpture and ceramics must be ready for display; weaving or quilts must be ready to hand; jewelry must be displayed in a holder or other display apparatus.

Reproduced prints of original paintings, matted-only items, or shrink-wrapped pieces will not be accepted.

Eligible Artists

For this show, the sponsoring organizations broadly define "Kodiak artist" to mean any artist residing in the Kodiak Island archipelago, or an artist whose work or artistic practice is significantly influenced by Kodiak Island. The latter may include, but are not limited to: former Kodiak Island residents, or artists from neighboring communities whose work is inspired by a sense of place and/or connection to Kodiak Island culture.

Number of Entries

A limit of four (4) original pieces of art will be accepted from any one artist.

Deadline

To participate in the 2021 Crab Festival Art Show, all forms and photographs must be completed and submitted by Friday, May 21, 2021. Artists who would like assistance in photographing their work should [make an appointment at The Frame Shop for assistance using this link](#). Bring artwork to the Kodiak Harbor Master building on Wednesday, May 26 between 12 pm and 2:30 pm. Artists who are unable to deliver artwork during this timeframe are encouraged to contact the sponsoring organizations to arrange for an alternative.

Entry Fee

There is a \$40 non-refundable fee per participating artist. After submitting digital entries through the online form, artists will receive an email with a link to pay the entry fee online. We recognize that the global pandemic has had a significant impact on the arts and culture sector broadly, and on individual artists. Artists may defer paying the entry fee until sales are realized and/or may participate without paying the fee. There is no fee for young artists in the Youth category.

Sales

Artists may choose to offer their work for sale, or may choose NSF (not for sale). All sales will be conducted online via the www.kodiakartshow.org website. The Kodiak Arts Council will collect funds on behalf of artists and issue payment to artists via check on or before June 15.

Youth Category

Kodiak artists ages 16 and younger are encouraged to submit work in the Youth Category of the Crab Fest Art Show. The Youth category will be accepting digital submissions of original work and the digital submissions will be displayed on a slide show at the exhibit venue and on the virtual exhibit at www.kodiakartshow.org. There is no fee for young artists to participate in the virtual show and works will be listed NSF (not for sale). Please do not bring Youth Art work to the exhibit venue.

Artist Statements (for virtual exhibit component)

Participating artists are encouraged to submit an artist statement describing who you are and your artistic practice (what you are and what you make it). Artists statements will be included in the virtual art show to share information about artists with the viewing public. Artists who participated in the 2020 Virtual Crab Fest Art Show need not re-submit their artist statements but are welcome to

Accepting digital submissions in .tiff, .jpg, or .png format with a minimum resolution of 150 ppi
