

Opportunities for Teaching Artists

Munartet Project

Multi-year initiative to grow educators who are competent and confident teaching in and through the arts and culture.

Partnership between KIBSD, Kodiak College, Kodiak Arts Council, Alutiiq Museum

Teaching Artists lead Arts Labs, co-teach Sum'Arts programs, lead classroom programs, develop lesson plans, help create arts supplies lending boxes, attend trainings and meetings

Opportunities for Teaching Artists: Additional Trainings

Pursue additional professional development opportunities

- Munartet Project Fall Launch
- Munartet Project Quarterly Meetings
- KIBSD Munartet/Arts Inservice (as space allows)
- Attend Arts Labs (second Saturdays)
- Attend Munartet Project workshops



Opportunities for Teaching Artists: Community Programs

Sum'Arts for Kids

- Multi-disciplinary arts instruction program for youth
- June to August annually
- 5 days a week for 2 hours a day
 = 10 hours of instruction
- Compensation based on \$50 per instructional hour plus reimbursable supplies budget



Spring Arts for Kids - over spring break week

Opportunities for Teaching Artists: Community Programs

Winter Arts Series

- Arts instruction program for Adults
- November to March
- Flexible schedule and structure
- Compensation based on enrollment



 Recent examples include Theatre Improv in the Drama Pod, Hand Lettering at the Brewery, Altered Books Workshop at the Library

Opportunities for Teaching Artists: School-based Programs

After-school Arts programs

- Elementary Schools: North Star, East, Peterson, Main
- Working in partnership with a teacher
- Spring and Fall
- Stipends through the School District




Opportunities for Teaching Artists: School-based Programs

Classroom Work

- Paired with a Munartet Project teacher anywhere in the district
- Work with the individual teacher to determine schedule and content best suited for their classroom
- Compensation based on \$45 per instructional hour





Opportunities for Teaching Artists: School-based Programs

Artist in Residence

- Long-established annual program
- Residency is two-weeks, typically whole school; Opportunities for shorter residencies in rural schools
- Artist-based; Subject-based;
 Materials-based



 Scheduled through KIBSD Arts & Culture Coordinator; work with school community to determine scope

Opportunities for Teaching Artists: Munartet Programs

Arts Labs

- Creative space for arts instruction and exploration
- 2 to 3 hours; second Saturday
- Working with Kodiak educators
- \$200 stipend + reimbursable supplies
- Other teaching artists can attend for fun and professional development






Opportunities for Teaching Artists: Munartet Programs

Arts Workshops

- Instruction for Kodiak educators
- Tend to be more intensive guided instruction; Arts integration approach is encouraged
- Working with Kodiak educators
- Stipend range determined by time investment + reimbursable supplies
