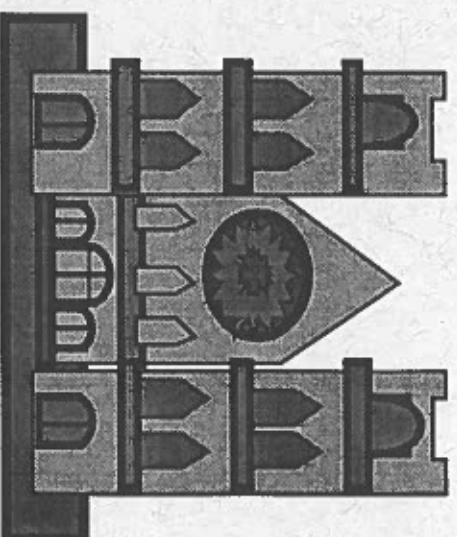
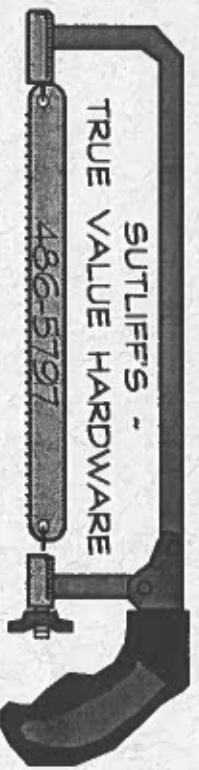

~William Shakespeare~

1564 - 1616

Surviving documents, that give us glimpses into the life of William Shakespeare, show us a playwright, poet, and an actor who grew up in the market town of Stratford-upon-Avon, spent his professional life in London, and returned to his home at Stratford a wealthy landowner.

During Shakespeare's play writing career, his company built a theater for themselves in 1599 across the river in London, naming it the Globe. The plays that are considered by many to be Shakespeare's major tragedies (Hamlet, Othello, King Lear, and Macbeth) were written while the company was resident in this theater, as were such comedies as "Twelfth Night" and "Measure for Measure". Many of his plays were performed at courts, towns and many theaters.

Shakespeare wrote very little after 1612, the year in which he probably wrote King Henry VIII. It was at this play that the Globe caught fire and burned to the ground. Between 1612-1613 he returned home to live in Stratford-upon-Avon, where he owned a large house, considerable property, and where his wife and married daughters lived (his son Hamnet died in 1596). Shakespeare died April 1616. He was buried inside the chancel of Holy Trinity Church in Stratford.
